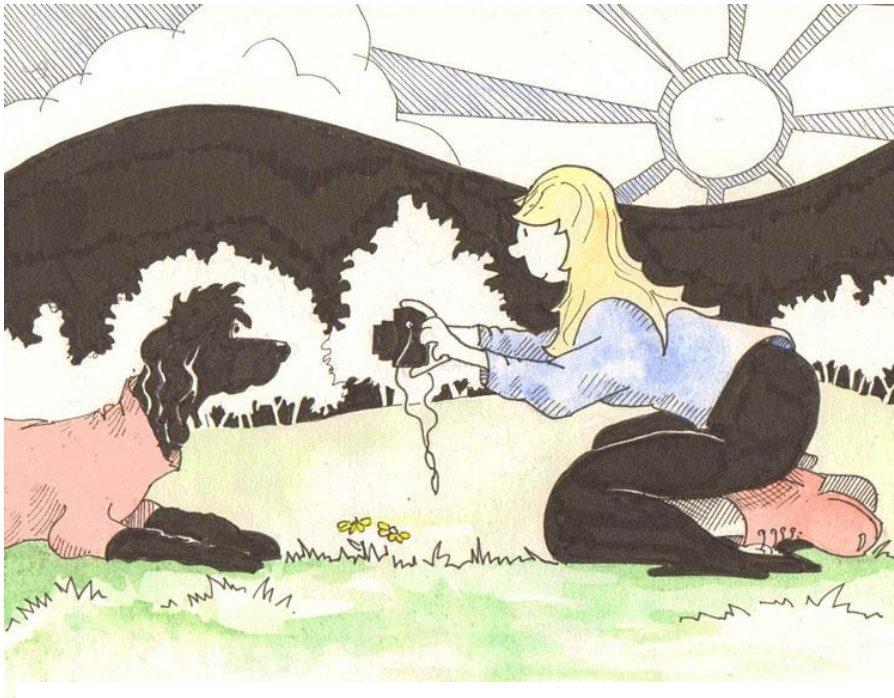


## HOW TO TAKE GOOD QUALITY PHOTOS



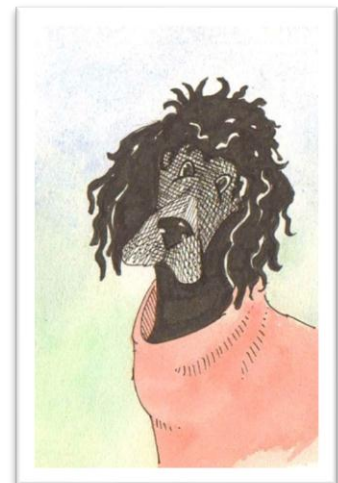

You may already have some photos or, sadly, only your memories and the photo album left – in which case, consider the points below when you are selecting the photos...

1. Track down your subject and consider their best features and attributes
2. Settle them down in a naturally lit spot which will do their colouring justice (outside is best)
3. Using a digital camera, get down to their level and take lots of pictures
4. Ensure that your subject fills the frame – zoom in
5. Select the best images and either print and post or email the jpegs to me

### Tips:

1. Try not to stand up and look down on them, unless that's the angle you'd like me to capture (eg. bird's eye view of curled up on your bed)
2. Check that the images you select show off their individuality – can you see the colour of their eyes, those spots on the tongue?
3. If you are commissioning a larger painting of the entire handsome body, give some thought to the setting, or include some additional images – such as bedding, favourite toys or the garden.
4. Or, you can send me what you have and I can advise on what extra shots I will need



If I haven't seen your pet, I will only have the photos to go by. I will use one shot to give me the pose and the rest for other details.
